Sentence

A sentence is a group of words containing a subject and predicate that gives a complete sense or meaning.

E.g. : I am running.

He is playing cricket.

Kinds of sentences

Declarative sentence (statement)

It tells about something or a simple statement.

E.g. : I have a blue dress.

Sita is dancing.

Imperative sentence (request or command)

It tells someone to do something. It can be order , command or request.

E.g. : Clean your room.

Give me the notebook.

Interrogative sentence (questions)

An interrogative sentence asks something.

It ends with (?) sign.

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E.g. : How are you ?

When is he coming ?

Exclamatory sentence (exclamation)

It shows strong feeling or emotion.

It ends with (!) sign.

E.g. : The man died in an accident!
